- ⇒ Created Additional Work-Based Learning Activities for Students.

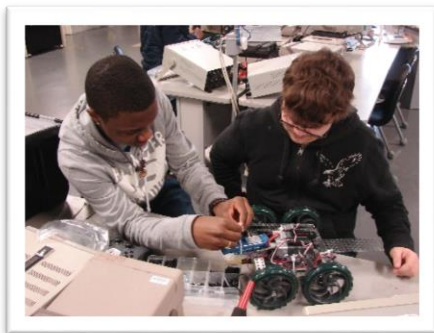


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PRIORITIES 2014-2015
